

This course focuses on the application of fundamental arithmetical computations to practical business problems. Topics studied include: percentages, purchase discounts, interest calculations, mark-up and mark-down, taxes and payroll.

To register you will need a registration code, which either should have been included in the purchase of a new text book or can be bought separately at this website.

Team Assignments: Your final grade can consist of up to 10 points for the *Team Assignments*. Everyone will be assigned to a team of 4-5 students. These teams will work on the Team Assignments as separately outlined.

Quizzes: Your final grade can consist of up to 45 points for Quizzes. There will be a quiz approximately every other week. Point values will vary for each quiz. There will be a total of 50 points worth of Quizzes during the semester to accumulate the maximum 45 points toward your final grade.

Quizzes will be **semi-cumulative**; i.e., each quiz will primarily cover the most current material but will also contain questions from previously covered material.

There will be no make-up quizzes. Missed quizzes forfeit the potential points.

Comprehensive Final Exam: There will be a standardized final exam for all sections of Business 101. This will be a comprehensive exam covering all the concepts covered during the semester and will be 25% of your final grade.

Adjustments: Your final grade will be subject to the following adjustments:

- Thereafter, every class missed (regardless of reason) will result in a 1 point deduction from your final grade.
